Where to begin? I'm sure you've heard by now that Judge Cooper wussed out and rebooked herself. My case was assigned to another judge (the 4<sup>th</sup>), this time a man. Hopefully, now that we have a judge with balls (haha), I can get a bond. My hearing will be on the 16<sup>th</sup> so the outcome will be old news by the time you get this. I am hopeful. Since you asked why I waived my right to a speedy trial, let me tell you a bit about my case. I never heard of her before, but Angela Levy is the D.A. up here. She's not very well liked, or so I'm told. She's taken a personal interest in my case and has, for political reasons, charged me with murder in the 1<sup>st</sup> degree. She presented her case to a grand jury and they agreed to indict me on those charges. I'm told that means nothing, as defense is not allowed to present their side during grand jury proceedings, and the prosecution usually gets what they want. We were waiting for the State to produce their evidence against me before we made a motion for a bond hearing. Because of the charge against me, I am not guaranteed a bond and my attorney wanted to have all the facts. The D.A.'s office was supposed to produce the "Discovery" by a certain date, but they were 10 days late. Once they did produce it, it was on a disc. All the



information was in Microsoft One Note, which is a proprietary application. To use One Note, you must have the latest version of M.S. Office, which requires the latest version of Windows. My lawyer does not have that software, and in any case, the standard electronic format for court documents is Adobe PDF (portable Document Format), which is an open standard. Long story short, Angelo Core's office took an additional 2 weeks to convert everything, then we were missing pages, etc. We got too close to the date we'd have to go to trial by, my attorney advised me to waive right to speedy trial, as he would not have had enough time to prepare. To top it all off, the DA's office has listed more than 100 potential witnesses. We have to depose them all, and it takes time and costs money. We asked the DA to identify which witnesses would be called to testify and she refused. That's when we decided to put in the motion to declare me an indigent defendant, as the state would then pay the expense of the 100+ depositions. Right now, the priority is to get me bonded out, then we'll do a reconsideration on the indigent hearing. Next, we'll finish the depositions and then finally seek out and hire a few expert witnesses. Someone who can testify about post traumatic stress, someone who



word body language so they can attest to the truthfulness of my and [redacted] <sup>on video</sup> statements. Know this though: We have an eyewitness in the form of a 911 caller who can place the SUV, with the occupants exited, in an area that was not searched by the police. We also have cell phone records showing that the driver made multiple, short duration phone calls, immediately after the incident.

Under Florida law, I do not have to prove self-defense. The State has to prove it was not. Since they did not search the area, they cannot. So this will be more than my word against theirs, thankfully. Even though the driver is a producer of "Garage Rap" videos. Search on "kill me a c" on YouTube and you should be able to find some of his "work". He has at least one video talking about putting someone out of their car and killing them.

Don't make any trouble for yourself, but I would appreciate it if you would somehow, anonymously, respond to any news article you come across. Jack's News 25 has a website that ran a recent article. They keep saying that I shot him because the music was too loud. Email Grandma [redacted] and ask her to send you the timeline that I wrote. [redacted]

 I have a much stronger case of self-defense  
 than Zimmerman. From what I've been told,  
 he has nothing to worry about. The governor

 Jury" has indicted Angela Corey on charges of  
 falsifying the arrest warrant for Zimmerman.

 after the Zimmerman verdict. Seems they have  
 a very low opinion of the black community, yet  
 hold them in high esteem if someone stands  
 up for themselves against them! I have written  
 extensively on the topic and will make



my views known when the time is right. If I can find a law firm to take my case, I want to sue Duval county for discrimination. They charge me with 1<sup>st</sup> degree murder, denying me bond, while they charged a black man, who shot & killed a white man, under circumstances that were plainly pre-meditated, with 2<sup>nd</sup> degree. He had prior convictions, to include illegal weapons and domestic violence charges and was released on 50K bond within 2 weeks of his arrest. That's just one example that we're aware of, I'm sure there are more. I want to put this behind me and get on with my life, but at the same time, I feel I must seek justice for myself and hopefully change the attitude of the courts. It is so sorry how racist everyone is up here, and how biased towards blacks the courts are. The jail is full of blacks and they all act like thugs. I think the legal system is scared of a backlash any time there is a white-on-black incident, but don't get excited when it's black on black, or even black-on-white. This may sound a bit radical, but if more people would arm themselves and kill these fucking idiots when they're threatening you, eventually they may take the hint and change

their behavior. As it is, going to jail is like a badge of honor for them. The "juvenile" - young men 15-17 yrs old, all housed right behind me. Armed robbery is the most common offense. I hear them talking - bragging - about shooting people. Boom! Boom! Boom! Eventually, we as a society will wake up and realize that we need to arm ourselves, as the government welfare programs have produced a culture of entitlement for a certain segment of our society. These kids feel entitled to live above the law and do violence at will. Remember when your mom was robbed? At gunpoint? Black Thug. Ok, I'm off my soapbox now. What! So what's this about you and [redacted] wanting to rent your own place? I thought [redacted] was engaged to the guy she's been staying with. I assume you're living there as well. [redacted] took the 3<sup>rd</sup> floor as the 1<sup>st</sup> is too noisy for her, she hates incoherent people, so she doesn't like people above her. She's always considerate and gets after me if I stomp around. [redacted] made friends with someone who trains dogs. He dropped by to work with Charlie, our French Bulldog. He said Charlie is very handsome and smart. He mastered sit, stay and lay down right away, were still working with him on walking on



The Lash. He tends to walk us! I'm curious to know what happened to your car. The next time you speak to your Mom, ask her for me. I wrote her a letter a while ago. I never heard back from her. That asshole neighbor in [redacted] called the Sheriff here and said I once put a gun to your mother's head! He made a few more outrageous claims, I think I am going to sue him. Anyway, ask your Mom if she got my letter. Hopefully I'll be able to call her and ask her myself soon! Back to this car thing. Eventually, you're going to buy another car. Until you turn 25, it doesn't make sense to finance a car, as the insurance will run \$400/month. I tried to tell your mother this when she was buying [redacted] a car, but she wouldn't listen. For now, you need to drive a used car, something that is paid for, so you can buy minimal insurance. In hindsight, we should have looked around some more and found you a used Honda. I wanted to get you a Del Sol, if you will recall. Whatever brand you decide, you MUST get a manual trans. You have enough driving experience now where shifting won't be a big distraction.
