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PROCEEDINGS

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THE VIDEOGRAPHER: Good morning, we are going on the record at 10:59 a.m. on May 17th, 2023.

Please note that microphones are sensitive and may pick up whispering and private conversations. Please mute your phones at this time.

Audio and video recording will continue to take place unless all parties agree to go off the record.

This is the Media Unit 1 of the video-recorded deposition of Vince Johnson in the matter of Joseph Maldonado versus BMG Rights Management, LLC, et al., filed in the United States District Court for the Northern District of Florida, Pensacola Division, Case No. 3:22-cv-18229-TKW-ZCB. The location of this deposition is 1220 Main Street, Suite 400, Vancouver, Washington, 98660.

My name is Rick Majewski and I'm representing Veritext Court Reporting and I'm the videographer. court reporter is Teresa Rider from the firm Veritext Court Reporting.

I am not authorized to administer oaths. not related to any party in this action nor am I financially interested in the outcome. If there are any objections to proceeding, please state them at the time of your appearances.

Counsel and all present, including remotely, will now state their appearances and affiliations beginning with the noticing attorney.

MR. PHILLIPS: John Phillips on behalf of Joseph Maldonado.

THE VIDEOGRAPHER: Will the court reporter please swear in the witness and then counsel may proceed.

VINCE JOHNSON,

called as a witness in behalf of the Plaintiff, having been duly sworn, was examined and testified as follows:

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EXAMINATION

13 BY MR. PHILLIPS:

- Q. Would you please state your name for the record.
 - A. Vince Johnson.
- Q. Mr. Johnson, my name is John Phillips. Good to meet you. Sorry under these circumstances.

Let me go through a few of the ground rules for purposes of today. One, this isn't a test of your endurance or any type of -- you know, my intention is to not have this be contentious or dramatic, right?

So if you need to take a break for any reason or if you and I don't see eye-to-eye on a question and answer, you know, let's take a break and come back and

get through this. My goal is to get through this, you know, as soon as possible.

A few things related to a deposition. If an answer is yes or no, try to answer with a yes or no, rather than a head nod or uh-huh or huh-uh, because it's not as clear on the record.

And if you answer a question -- if you don't understand a question, please let me know because you're sworn to tell the truth and the last thing I want you to do is answer a question that you didn't understand and then we're trying to figure it out later; is that fair?

A. Yep.

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Q. Okay. I'm going to start off with a little bit of background.

Where are you from?

- A. I was born in Portland. Live here in Vancouver.
- Q. Okay. We're in Vancouver, Washington. Is the Portland/Vancouver area where you've lived throughout your career?
 - A. Here and Phoenix and Nashville.
 - Q. What is your career?
- 23 A. Musician, songwriter.
- O. How long have you been a songwriter?
- 25 A. Since Hitler was a corporal. A long time.

- Q. Since Hitler was a corporal. Talking about Adolph Hitler?
 - A. Yeah.

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- Q. And do you have any other -- related to Joseph Maldonado, other than singer or songwriter, have you provided him any other services?
 - A. You're talking about Joe Exotic, correct?
- Q. Correct.
 - A. No.
- Q. How did you come to meet or interact with Joe
 11 Exotic?
 - A. He had an ad on Craig's List seeking crew members and so I emailed him. He needed a theme song for your park. I can write you one.
 - Q. So he had an ad -- let me clarify. He had an ad on Craig's List and you were searching national listings --
 - A. I was scouring -- it was in Oklahoma, right? I was scouring work looking for work and I popped him.
- Q. Have you ever been in the same room as Joe 21 Exotic?
- 22 A. No.
- Q. And I assume by that you've never visited his park in Oklahoma.
- 25 A. No.

- Q. And when you responded to the ad, was the ad seeking songwriters?
 - A. No.

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- Q. What was it seeking?
- A. I don't know. Crew members for the videos to film his animals, sound, perhaps cameraman. I don't remember.
 - Q. He was filming some sort of reality show, and was it crew for that, do you recall?
 - A. He didn't specify.
 - Q. Okay. But you said, hey -- were you responding to try to get a job as the crew or did you independently pitch, hey, let me do a song for you?
 - A. Correct.
 - O. The latter?
 - A. Yeah.
 - Q. And how did that go? What happened next?
 - A. He got right back to me, said, great.
 - O. Okay. And what happened next?
 - A. Obviously, I asked him what he wanted the song about, and he gave me his spiel about Peter being mean to him, et cetera. And Tigers. He gave me the details of what he wanted me to, perhaps, come up with a song about.
- Q. Right. And for other clients of yours, you know, how does that creative process work? I assume

you've written -- I know for a fact you've written songs for other musicians, correct?

- A. Other people have done my songs.
- O. Right.

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A. Specifically to writing a song for, you know,
Joe Blow, an individual, I've only done that three times.
Like, they had a problem with Meineke muffler. I was
hired me to write a song. I wrote the Meineke song,
clever guy. But anyways, it was paid the next day.

And then -- oh, for a movie, Trailer Park Zombies or some bullshit.

- Q. That's okay.
- A. Some low budget movie. He gave me the outline.

 So with exotic, it was kind of like, to me, an exercise to see if I can do it, because I'm pretty good at that, I think.
 - Q. That's what I'm trying to understand.

Certainly there would be creativity that you come up with on your own and pitch to somebody or then kind of collaborative idea is, hey, I've got a problem with Meineke mufflers.

A. Yeah, two totally different things. If I write a song on my own, I might write about that chair. But if you tell me you have a specific theme for a specific subject matter, you know...

- Q. Is it fair that's essentially what Joe Exotic had, he wanted songs about tigers and Carole and his life --
 - A. Yes.

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- O. -- similar to the Meineke muffler?
- A. Correct.
 - Q. Okay. Related to your deposition, we sent you this document is entitled Amended Notice of Taking Videotape Deposition of Vince Johnson. Page 4 had some documents.

Did you bring any documents with you today?

- A. I don't have any documents.
- Q. Okay. Did you keep a copy of any of the contracts?
- A. No.
 - Q. Did you keep a copy of any of the emails?
- 17 A. No.
 - Q. Do you have access to the email account that you used back then?
 - A. Sure. Same one that I have now. But, see, you're asking for this stuff. This was back in 2020. I never heard of you until eight months ago and you didn't ask for this until three months ago or two months ago, if even that.
- 25 Q. Okay.

- A. So to think I have emails from 2020 is -- I don't.
 - Q. Well, I'll even go further back.

Some of the emails I'm looking for to see if you have copies of are from May of 2013.

A. No.

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- Q. Okay. Is there a folder in your email or like your sent folder that would have emails dating that far back?
- A. I hired a guy, George Stevens, to try to retrieve all that information. He couldn't do it.
- Q. Okay. Let me -- in some of the questions I'm going to ask, of course, are going to be a little weirder and wilder than others, but let me get through them. We talked about that you haven't met Joe Exotic in person.

 Okay?

Have you ever met Joe Lowe in person?

- A. No.
 - O. James Garretson?
- 20 A. No.
- 21 O. Carole Baskin?
- 22 A. No.
- Q. The Tiger Team producers?
- 24 A. No.
- Q. Okay. Did you have any role in the -- now I'm

going to separate this, and I'll tell you ahead of time
what I'm separating. I'm talking about Tiger King the
production, and then Tiger King the production that

4 licensed music, right? In the production, I mean filming.

Did you have any involvement where or were you filmed or interviewed by Tiger King?

- A. No.
- Q. When did you first have contact with somebody about the licensing of music in the documentary Tiger King?
 - A. 2018, maybe.
- 13 Q. Okay.

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- A. A producer contacted me and asked for, you know, wanted to license some songs. I believe it was 2018.
 - Q. Were you compensated for that?
- 18 A. Yes.
- 19 O. How much?
 - A. I plead the Fifth. I've conferred with my attorney and --
 - Q. Now, the Fifth Amendment is what people take under the Bill of Rights when they feel like they are going to incriminate themselves and possibly expose themselves to criminal charges, so respectfully, I don't

think the Fifth Amendment would be applicable here. But I understand if you have a contract and you feel that there's a nondisclosure agreement in there.

- A. I think it is applicable. The court will recognize my pleading the Fifth. I don't think what I was paid or wasn't paid is, you know, your business.
- Q. Okay. Well, that's an objection to relevance, and we'll handle that and come back to this, then.

So how many emails back and forth did you have with Joe Exotic?

A. 300, maybe.

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- Q. Okay. How many phone calls?
- A. I believe four, three or four.
- Q. Okay. Do you recall anything specific from those phone calls?
- A. Not really, no. Oh, other than him saying, great work, keep it up, blah, blah, blah.
- Q. Okay. So I'm going to start my first exhibit, and this is going to be Plaintiff's Exhibit 1. And the court reporter will put a little sticker on it, but this is a copy for you to look at, and I'm going to go kind of page by page.

My understanding of what -- well, what this is is through assembling Joe's email, this is Joe's email, your email back to Joe, as I understand it to be, and

then, you know, on the left, you'll see dates. At some point, there's -- things other than email that try to put this whole thing in chronological order.

- A. Okay. Are these the entire emails?
- Q. This is my understanding these are the entire emails. But I got to start off saying I'm obviously missing -- I think I'm obviously missing some, and I think I'm missing at least the first one, because we start -- it seems to me we start mid-conversation. If you look on the first page, May 24th, 2013, regarding I Saw a Tiger, so clearly there was an email that is missing entitled I Saw a Tiger?
 - A. Yeah, there may be quite a few missing.
- Q. Yeah, if we have 300, I don't have 300 here.

 But let's do our best to kind of run through, you know -run through these as quickly as we can.

So going back to May 24th, 2013, this says, from Joe Exotic to Vince Johnson. You are freaking awesome. I will get with you after my show and get your PayPal again.

Is that referring to the -- him getting you to write I Saw a Tiger, do you recall that?

- A. I would assume, yes.
- Q. When you said you were kind of pitching a song for Joe or Joe's show, is the first show, I Saw a Tiger?

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- A. Yes. And it wasn't for his show. He didn't have a show. He specifically told me to play at his gift shop.
 - Q. Okay. Okay. And May 24th, I have a response, is VinceJohnson@q.com, is that your email address?
 - A. Yes.

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Q. And I you never know what people will like, and you were a bit nervous, glad you liked it.

Do you recall that?

- 10 A. I don't recall, but it sounds like what I might 11 say.
 - Q. Okay. And at this point, you and Joe -- is it fair to say you and Joe were at the early stages of a relationship where he was -- he was purchasing your services?
 - A. Correct.
 - Q. Okay. And those services were songwriting?
 - A. Correct.
- 19 Q. Okay.
 - A. Should I wait until you ask a question?
- Q. If you need to clarify, you're welcome to clarify.
- A. The very first song, I Saw a Tiger, okay, when
 I talked to Joe on the phone for the very first song, he
 told me he wanted to use the song -- he had a gift shop

at his zoo and he was going to play it and people walking through, they can hear it and they can buy stuff out of his gift shop.

He didn't say anything, not word one, about him pretending to perform the song, let alone write it.

- Q. Okay. Okay.
- A. I didn't learn that until a couple of months later --
 - Q. Okay.
- A. -- when I just happened to be on YouTube and I typed in Joe, what's this dude up to? And there he was up on that pickup pretending he was the singer and the songwriter.
 - Q. We'll get into that in the emails.
- 15 A. Okay.

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- Q. We'll get through that. If there's anything you feel was left out, we'll have a collaborative process through this, because I just want to know the truth.
- A. Okay. I was duped right from the beginning.
- Q. You certainly -- there's some emails in here that you address it, and you address it also -- because Danny was pissed?
 - A. To say the least.
- O. So like I said, we'll get through it.
- 25 A. Okay.

Q. So moving for May 31st, page 1, Joe said: This is the song I opened my magic show with about my brother. You can change it around, shorten it, to get the point across and make it a sad country song. See what you can do. Don't use the ending message. That is different.

Now, was that the GW and Me song that he's talking about there or My First Love?

- A. About his brother, it has to be about GW.
- Q. Okay. And do you recall what he submitted to you to change it around?
- A. No, because -- it should be somewhere in here or on the phone, I told him that I'll do my thing, you know. I'm not going to be changing, like, if he didn't like -- which he never did. He always loved the songs.
 - Q. Right.
 - A. Well, what was your question? I'm sorry.
- Q. So it looks like he sent you some written materials.
 - A. He emailed me about his brother, GW, who died.
 - Q. Right.
 - A. He wanted me to write a song about it --
- 22 Q. Okay.

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- A. -- which I caught him in an interview saying he wrote the song.
 - Q. We're going to get into all that.

1 A. Okay.

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Q. May 31st, I have what we'll mark as Plaintiff's 2.

(Deposition Exhibit Nos. 1 and 2 were marked for identification.)

BY MR. PHILLIPS:

Q. So 2, which says Exhibit 1 at the bottom, we're going to go by the yellow sticky, says -- is dated May 31st. It says 113, my understanding was 2013. That there was an agreement between Joe Exotic and Vince Johnson -- Vince Johnson, Clinton Johnson Band.

Who is The Clinton Johnson Band?

- A. That's the singer, Danny has passed away.
- Q. Right. And the producer has produced a song entitled I Saw a Tiger, says original composition, that was your composition?
 - A. IJh-huh.
- Q. And was solely composed, produced and recorded by him?
 - A. And --
 - Q. And then the next line: He relinquishes all copyrights, publishing rights and all other rights of said song to include any and all uses to the company.

What does that mean?

1 A. I'm sorry. Say that again.

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Q. Paragraph 2, line 2: He relinquishes all copyrights, publishing rights and all other related rights of said song to include any and all uses to the company.

What does that mean?

- A. Well, see, you're getting ahead of yourself.

 This was only after the fact. He came up with this after he had made that video and was using the song without my permission.
- Q. Okay. Okay. So if the date's wrong, then the date's wrong?
 - A. Oh, it's definitely wrong.
 - Q. Okay. But did you sign it?
- 15 A. I did.
 - Q. Okay. And the company is referenced as Joe Schreibvogel, aka Joe Exotic.

So based upon this contract, Vince Johnson and The Clint Johnson Band, the producer, relinquishes all copyrights, publishing rights and all other related rights of said song, which was I Saw a Tiger, to the company, which was Joe Schreibvogel, aka Joe Exotic, true?

A. Yes, but again, this was after he had made the video and already claiming that he wrote it.

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A. This was -- okay.

Okay.

- Q. Okay. And we're going to get into that, because there was more money that was ultimately charged for him to take credit.
 - A. No.

Ο.

Q. Okay. Next line of the second paragraph: All rights of the song I Saw a Tiger will rest with the company in perpetuity.

Do you know what in perpetuity means?

- A. I do.
 - Q. Forever, right?
- 13 A. Yeah.
 - Q. In all jurisdictions and through all process once this agreement is executed.

What's your -- do you contend that this contract, which you're holding in your hand, is invalid?

A. I do because it's after the fact. I had no intention of selling him the songs. He stole right from the beginning. It's true. I signed it. No question about that. But here's the thing, he wanted his song, like I told you, to play at his theme park, shopping thing, you know, he sells doodads and whatnots. He told me that's what he wanted, this very first song, I Saw a Tiger for.

And then like I say, a while later, I was curious one night. I got on YouTube and there he was up on a pickup truck lip-syncing it, taking credit, like he's the singer/songwriter.

- Q. Okay. And I get the argument to use the expression cart before the horse, right? I get Joe was holding this out or lip-syncing, to use your words, this song, and you saw it and said, hey, that's not the deal.
 - A. It wasn't. Yeah, exactly.
 - Q. But then you signed the deal.
 - A. After the fact.
- Q. Okay. Have you -- is there another contract after this that changes this transfer of music rights agreement? In other words, related to I Saw a Tiger, did you have any other contracts?
- A. No no written contracts. Like I say, it was verbal -- our first verbal contract, he was going to play I Saw a Tiger, which I wrote for him, strictly in his theme park. You see what I'm saying?
 - Q. Uh-huh.
- A. That's what he told me he wanted the song for. He said nothing about lip-syncing and acting like he wrote it and sang it.
 - Q. All right. But whenever you signed this --
 - A. After the fact.

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- Q. -- after the fact, whenever you signed this you relinquished all copyrights, publishing rights and related right of the song to Joe.
 - A. According to this, yes. And I signed it, I did, yes.
 - Q. And you gave it to him forever, no matter what.
 - A. Right. That was after the fact.
 - O. Right.

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- A. After he had already written me off. After he was already singing it as a performer. But, yes, I did sign it.
- Q. If you contend you were ripped off, why would you then sign an agreement saying, okay, you can have this forever?
 - A. Because he was paying me, obviously.
- Q. Okay. So you got consideration. You got payment for this transfer of music rights agreement.
- A. Yeah. Not what he promised, yeah, but I did get some payment.
- Q. I think we get into that in an email. But some were clear, you do contend, and I think it makes sense that the day 5-31-113 is wrong.
- A. Yes, yes.
- Q. Going back to Exhibit 1, the chronology, there's an item in degree. And it appears on June 1st,

- 2013, Joe says: I'll transfer two hundred dollars -I'll transfer 200 on Monday, so I don't have to look
 through tons of emails. What was your PayPal again?
 What was the \$200 for?
 - A. Okay. Run that by me, again.
 - Q. Looking at the June 1st email. It's gray in yours; it's green in mine. It looks like Joe transferred \$200.

Do you recall what that was for?

- A. Oh, it would have to be for music, for songs.
- Q. How much originally were you charging Joe per song -- per song written for him?
- A. That first one, I just -- it was kind of an exercise to me. Like I had done the Meineke song. I wanted to see if someone gave me a specific subject to try. It was only 450 bucks, that first song.
- Q. Okay. And what I -- I'm going to do it this way. The email address, so I'm not saying it out loud or it will print on the record, the email address on June 1, 2013, at the bottom, starting with the word real is that your email address?
 - A. No.
 - Q. Whose email address is that?
- A. I don't know.
 - Q. Have you ever had, since it's not yours,

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- 1 | realmensingloudandstrong@Gmail.com?
 - A. Danny. That's Danny.
 - Q. Okay. That's Danny's email address?
- 4 A. Correct. Yeah.
 - Q. Did you share a PayPal with Danny?
- 6 A. No.

- Q. Was Danny -- how did -- at this point, why was

 Joe told to pay Danny instead of you?
 - A. Danny was the singer.
- Q. Okay. June 2nd, looks like Joe emails you about recording in a studio.
- 12 Is that when Danny went in and recorded one of the songs?
- 14 A. Sure, I quess.
- 15 Q. What studio would Danny use?
- 16 A. Various studios around, garage studios.
- Q. Was Danny local to here or was he somewhere else?
- 19 A. No. No, Danny is local.
- 20 Q. Okay.
- 21 A. I forgot my glasses. I brought sunglasses.
- Q. June 12th, 2013, I believe there's an email
 from Vince Johnson to Joe Exotic: Hi, Joe, just sent you
- 24 | GW and Me, I hope you like it.
- So when you'd send Joe a song, would you send

- 1 | him the written text or would you send him --
- A. No, I never sent him the lyrics. You take what

 I -- you give me the idea; you like it or you don't.
- Q. Okay. And Joe responded: Got it. What's your PayPal again?

So he needed to pay you for that one.

- A. Right.
- Q. And: trying to put my thoughts together for a third song. Hope I am not being a pain in butt, but you're awesome.

So Joe was obviously happy with your services and went from one song to two songs to three songs?

- A. Uh-huh.
- 14 | 0. That's a yes?
- 15 A. Yes.

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- 16 Q. You gave me one of those no-no uh-huhs.
- 17 A. Yes, sir.
 - Q. That's fair. And then June 12th Joe says: Got some ideas of how to turn it into a music video, so you up to another one?
 - Do you recall that email?
- 22 A. Where are we at?
- Q. June 12. It's the one -- yeah, it's that one, top of the page.
 - A. Okay. And your question?

- Q. Do you recall Joe mentioning that he has some ideas of how to turn it into a music video?
- A. He's turned them all into videos, yeah. Whatever.
- Q. Okay. But you knew as of June 12 that Joe intended to turn these songs into music videos.
 - A. Right.

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- Q. Then June 14th, I think he's giving you information about Terry Thompson and the Zanesville stuff and asked for a song.
- A. I don't have my damn glasses. Is that the one at the bottom?
- Q. Yes, sir. And if anything I need to read, I can read. He talks about his friend in Ohio.
 - A. Yeah, could you please read it?
- Q. Yeah. Sure. It's very small: Vince, one more sad song, and I promise the rest will be more positive. Take you time on this one, if you have to. I'm putting a couple of links for you to read. My friend in Ohio, I swear he was killed and did not do this himself or his animals. The animal rights people set this whole thing up to gain control of the exotic animal industry and pass the laws they want. I still believe he would have not let the animals out to be killed. And why would he cut cages there when he had the key? Let me know if you

think this is too much. I would like to have a song that would raise the question and clear this man's name to some point or at least make people think.

And then he gave you two links.

- A. Yeah. Okay.
- Q. Do you recall writing a song about --
- A. Terry Thompson -- yeah, I remember clicking on those links and reading up.
 - O. Which one was it? What was the name of it?
 - A. I don't remember my own damn songs.
- Q. Was that My First Love?
- 12 A. No.

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- Q. The song says Pretty Woman Lover. I'll show it to you in a second.
- A. That's pathetic. I can't remember my own damn songs. I have medical issues that stem from my brain.

 That's embarrassing.
 - O. We can come back to it.
 - A. I can sing the song, but I can't remember the name.
 - Q. You responded: I remember this story -- June 14th, the top of the next page: I don't care for that PETA bunch and others like them to begin with. I'll come up with something.
 - A. They strike me as single-minded radical nuts.

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- Q. Right.
- A. You, me and a possum could be laying on the ground injured and they would step over us to help the possum.

Yeah, okay. Which is true.

Q. I think it is true, but that's neither here nor there.

And June 14 Joe says: Some other small ones, I'll send you the first 200 tonight.

And then it says: If you can come up with similar music as I Saw a Tiger, OMG -- meaning, oh, my God -- that was so awesome. GW and Me was hard to hear, cried every time. You're awesome. Okay?

June 14th, 2013, it's the one that looks like this. I skipped a couple of pages. I read all I could on Terry and the situation, and the song just came. I put some venom into it. I think it sounds pretty cool. I'll get the music done next week.

So it looks like from that email you had written the Terry Thompson song and sent it to Joe and he loved it.

- A. Evidently.
- Q. And the next one is a little confusing to me, because I want to understand the context. Joe says:

 You're the man -- which is a compliment. Thank you.

It says: His poor wife has been through hell with the media and all and I've been basically all she has as a voice. I want to surprise her with a music video in honor of Terry.

I assume that's just referring to Joe's relationship with Terry Thompson's wife.

- A. I would assume so, too, I don't know.
- Q. Then it looks like June 16th is when we get into the YouTube discovery, because the bottom of that email dated June 16th, 2013, at 7:15 p.m. from you to Joe: Hey, Joe, I just got a call from my singer.

I assume that's referring to Danny.

A. Uh-huh.

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- Q. He was pretty hot, LOL. You need to understand the ego of singers, they're huge. Anyways, he came across I Saw a Tiger on YouTube.
 - A. Which I told him about.
- Q. And wants to know about the credits: You are going to credit the Clinton Johnson Band, correct?

 Thanks, Vince.
 - A. Did I put credited?
- Q. I'm skipping, you know, kind of typos, for purposes of this. I'm not picking on you about typos.

Then Joe responds: Yeah, the guy who put the credits on didn't know your name and has been out of town

and he's going to remake it when he gets back out of town. For now I'll do the credit in the description of the YouTube. I know how to do that.

And then you respond: Great --

- A. Which was a lie. Joe was lying.
- O. What was the lie?
- A. He done that on purpose.
- Q. Okay.

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- A. You know, he took credit for the song on purpose. There was no trying to blame it on somebody else.
- Q. Okay.
 - A. I talked to Joe on the phone about that.
- Q. Great. You say: Great, if you can add that, we're good to go.

And then we get into another small one, unfortunately. June 16th, 2013: Vince, just called my producers of the show and that does my stuff here. Seems now we are in a pissing war. This is the second email me and you had.

And it gets even smaller: Hi, Joe. Well, if they're songs I already have recorded, six new ones and the 15 on the MySpace, \$100 per song to write and record something specific, 250 per song. Thanks, Vince.

And then it says: The producer, JT, had that

- contract you all sent, so we could do it and promote the song to save the tigers --
 - A. I need to read this.
 - Q. Okay. Where are you glasses?
- 5 A. Home.
 - Q. How far away?
- A. Eight miles. Is there a Dollar Store around
- 8 here?

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- Q. I don't know.
- 10 A. Hi-School Pharmacy --
- 11 Q. We'll go off the record.
- 12 THE VIDEOGRAPHER: The time is 11:42 and we are off the record.
- 14 (Off the record.)
- 15 THE VIDEOGRAPHER: The time is 11:53 a.m. and
- 16 | we are back on the record.
- 17 BY MR. PHILLIPS:
- Q. I think the -- I think if we blow this one up
- 19 -- this one I've got to go into detail. I want him to be
- 20 able to see it.
- 21 So if we could go back off and just blow this
- 22 one page up or I can give you the small ones -- let's
- 23 | just go off.
- THE VIDEOGRAPHER: The time is 11:54 a.m. and
- 25 | we are off the record.

- 1 (Off the record.)
- THE VIDEOGRAPHER: The time is 12:07 p.m. and
- 3 | we are back on the record.
- 4 BY MR. PHILLIPS:
- Q. Okay. Mr. Johnson, where we left was a small
- 6 | print problem and I think the attempted solution is to
- 7 magnify through copying some of these harder to read
- 8 emails.
- The one that I'm last referring to is June
- 10 16th. It looks like this. Did we not get that one?
- 11 June 17th. June 16th. Here we go. June 16th. June
- 12 | 15th -- oh, wait. I'm in '14. June 16th, '13. For some
- 13 | reason I think we missed the one that we need.
- 14 A. May not have handed it to him. I apologize.
- 15 Are you talking about this one?
- Q. Yes. Can we get one more?
- 17 THE VIDEOGRAPHER: The time is 12:09 and we are
- 18 off the record.
- 19 (Off the record.)
- 20 THE VIDEOGRAPHER: The time is 12:12 p.m. and
- 21 we are back on the record.
- 22 BY MR. PHILLIPS:
- Q. Okay. Mr. Johnson, I think now we have a large
- 24 | version of the June 16th emails.
- Do you have one that you can read?

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- A. I do.
- Q. I want to give you time to read it as needed.

 Let me know when you're done.
 - A. What was your question?
 - Q. Fair enough. Content that I want to ask about is some of the stuff that's in the second paragraph. Joe references going online and posting bad comments on my YouTube is not cool.

After you or Danny discovered that I Saw a Tiger was a video on YouTube, did one of you post comments to the YouTube video?

- A. No. I believe that was just -- that's what we would do.
 - Q. You believe that's what you would do?
- A. I believe that was a threat that's what could happen, yeah.
 - Q. And then: I can sing and have access to a studio in Dallas to record over if that needs to be done.

Is that Joe saying that he can just record over Vince's voice?

- A. Danny's voice.
 - Q. Sorry. Sorry, Danny's voice.
- A. Who knows what he's thinking there, which he couldn't.
 - Q. Well, he has the ability to sing, some might

- not consider it as esthetically pleasing as Danny, fair?

 Anybody can sing, they just might suck at it.
 - A. Yeah. That's an idle threat on his part.
 - Q. The email from Joe ends that he doesn't want bad blood between us, correct?
 - A. Correct.
 - Q. And then we go to June 17th, the one that starts: Hey, Joe. Danny just called me.
 - A. Okay.

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- O. Got that?
- 11 A. Yeah.
- Q. So June 17th, 1:56:29 p.m., you emailed Joe and said: Hey, Joe. Danny just called and says he wants

 \$2,000 a song to sell you all rights --
 - A. Wait a minute. You're on June 17th?
- Q. June 17th. That's a different one. I don't know if this was one that was blown up or not. There's a lot of June 17.
- Do you have the page before that, June 16?
- 20 June 16. I got it. All right?
- Did I give you the right one? Hold on. No, I

 didn't. June 17th, Danny just called. All right. I'll

 refer you to this one, right there.
- 24 A. Okay.
- 25 Q. I'll read this into the record: Hey, Joe.

Danny just called me and he says he wants \$2,000 a song
to sell you all rights without credits, meaning you can
say you wrote the song, sang it, whatever. Please don't
be mad at me. I'm just telling you what the man wants.
It's funny you should mention Toby Keith. I had a
manager for a minute -- probably, I had a similar
manager.

A. Yeah.

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- Q. But am I reading that correctly that after you or Danny saw the YouTube, you went back to Joe and told him he could have all rights to the songs without the need for credits and he could say he wrote or sang them for \$2,000 a song?
- A. Well, I don't know. I mean, there may be something missing here.

And keep in mind -- this is obviously what has been said, but this was after the fact that he had already, from the very beginning song, I Saw a Tiger, he ripped me off, tried to.

- Q. Okay.
- A. But, yeah, if I said this, I said it.
- Q. Okay. And that's the order that's important here, right, so you felt like Joe did you wrong?
- A. He did.
 - Q. You addressed it with him?

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- A. Yes.
- Q. And then you said, look, to make this right, you pay me \$2,000 a song?
 - A. Something like that.
- Q. And then you signed a contract that said, all right, you have the rights to these songs after Joe paid you?
- A. Yes and no. Again, I keep poking on this, that was only after he had ripped me off on I Saw a Tiger. He was supposed to just play that at his trinket store. He wasn't supposed to take credit for it.

So in order to -- I like writing songs.

- Q. Yeah.
- A. Sure, man, send me whatever. I'll sign it, you know. So, yeah, I guess, you know.
- Q. But my point is, yeah, you keep referencing that Joe did something wrong and didn't use the song as you thought he would.
 - A. Right, the very first song.
 - Q. And then you caught him?
- A. Right.
- Q. And you reached another deal where you guys got paid more to get rid of the rights to that song.
- 24 A. Correct.
 - Q. But you still think that you have the rights to

that song, even though you sold them?

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- A. Yeah, because he didn't -- I hope it's in here. He didn't honor this. Are there parts in here about him going to pay \$7,000 a song? Is there parts in here that says he's got -- going to have a reality show on the Animal Planet? Are there parts in here that he promises, oh, I'm good for blah, blah, blah. I'll make it good for you?
- Q. Right. And we're going to get into some of that about other songs, but what I'm trying to understand is we have a deal and we have a signed contract. And my understanding is he paid the \$2,000 for I Saw a Tiger.

Is any of that wrong? You had a signed contract and he paid the \$2,000 for that song?

- A. Right. But that was after the fact that he stole it. That was after the fact he lip-sync'd and pretended it was his.
 - Q. Right. And I get that, but if --
- A. I signed the contract. There's no doubt about that.
- Q. But if I take your glasses when you're in the bathroom and you walk in here and say, where are my glasses? And the court reporter tells you, John took your glasses. All right? You can at that point call the police because I took your glasses or you can address it

with me.

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And if you address it with me -- and if you address it with me and I said, look, I thought they were my glasses. Let me give you \$500 for your glasses, and you say, okay. Who owns those glasses?

- A. I see what you're saying, but you shouldn't have stolen my glasses to begin with, should you?
- Q. Correct, but does that change the fact that if I paid you \$500 for those glasses, they're my glasses?
 - A. In that scenario, you are correct.

But if you said I'll give you 500 for those glasses then I'll pay you 500 more down the road then, you know. True, you paid me \$500 for the glasses, but where's the other 500 you said you were going to pay me?

Q. And I know there's money, that you guys get into a money argument about other songs.

Is that what you're talking about?

- A. Yes. And about this song.
- Q. Okay. Okay.

All right. Going to the bottom of that same page, the June 17, 2013 at 11:52 a.m.: Vince, we just got over all these tornadoes and floods here, kind of strapped, see if he will cut me a break on this one and take \$1,500, which I have in PayPal right now. The zoo rescue business sucks now, if you know what I mean. It

1 goes from bad weather to 100 degrees in the same week.

So is that Joe saying, all right, you offered \$2,000 to sell all rights, but let me lower that price to \$1,500?

- A. Evidently.
- Q. All right. And then the next page: Hey, Joe.

 I just talked to him --
 - A. All right. Hold on.
 - O. Got that?
 - A. Yeah.

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- Q. Hey, Joe, I just talked to him.

 Is that referring to Danny?
 - A. I would assume.
 - Q. Deal. You can have JT or whoever write something up saying whatever you like and I'll have him sign it. On the new song I will go in in a day or two, this stuff is throwing me off and get music done.

And then the next email from Joe to you:
That's cool, no hurry, I will send you over something.
Sorry we got stuck in the middle of egos, but could not expect anything less. I will never tell anyone I sang that, as I said, let them guess, makes it a lot funnier than giving them an answer either way. Okay?

- A. Did you hear that?
- Q. Just wait. It changes.

- A. I never told anybody I would sing that. From the get-go, he acted like he was a performer.
 - Q. You sold him all rights.
 - A. We're talking about --
 - Q. I know what he said, but it changes as the emails go.
 - A. Okay.

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- Q. But you also said on June 17th, I'm going to sell you all rights without credits, meaning you can say you wrote the song or sang it. You said that, right?
 - A. Run that by me again.
- Q. You said you're selling him all rights and you say you can say you sang it or wrote it.
- A. Okay. You got me there. But that was after the fact he had ripped me off and already pretended to be the singer.
- Q. And the fact that I stole your sunglasses, I overpaid you for the price of the sunglasses and you can't keep accusing me of stealing.
- A. No, no, because we agreed. You gave me 500 for those sunglasses.
 - Q. Right.
- A. We agreed on 1,000. Where is my other 500 you owe me?
 - Q. Okay. And Joe and you agreed for \$1,500, which

1 he paid you.

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- A. I don't know.
- 3 Q. Okay.
 - A. Are you going to read all of this or just skip around to the ones you like?
 - Q. I'm going to look at them all. And I think

 I've been pretty fair about -- like I just read the one
 that wasn't great for me -- for Joe.
 - A. I'm not accusing you of --
- Q. I'm going to try -- I want the whole story to be on the record.
- 12 A. Okay.
- Q. And these are everything that I have, so...
- 14 A. I think we would have to go in order.
- 15 Q. Correct. And that's my intention.
- 16 A. I mean, not skip any of them.
- Q. Well, some of them, like we're talking about
 Toby Keith or, you know, some of the BS --
- 19 A. Okay.
- Q. Again, I'm here. I'm here until they kick me out.
- 22 So June 17th, the music for You Can't Believe, 23 the Terry Thompson story, You Can't --
- A. You're skipping over some.
 - Q. What am I missing? You might have gotten them

- 1 out of order.
 - A. No.

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- O. Which one is that?
- A. Vince, I'm just an old country boy --
- O. Hold on.
 - A. And that bullshit. Excuse me.
- Q. June 17th, 2013, yours had more than mine did.

 Let me see -- let me see that one. Okay. Here it is.

 Okay.
- June 17th, from Joe to Vince: I know you do good work.
 - A. You have done right by me, that's Joe talking.
 - Q. Yeah. I'm mainly doing these songs to make them wonder what the hell I'm up to because they are awesome songs, not like I am going to get rich off of them.
 - So last line: So how about you talk to your group and come up with a price with credits -- sorry -- for credits or without?
 - A. Right.
 - Q. That means that Joe is paying 200, 250 a song, and you expected him to credit the band, right?
 - A. The very first song, yeah, I thought it was 450, but it could have been 250.
 - O. Whatever. Less than 500.

- A. From the very get-go. That's my point in this.

 He ripped me off right from the very get-go.
 - Q. I understand. But then you seem -- not to go back to the sunglasses point, that at some point you caught him, right?
 - A. I did.

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- Q. And then you renegotiate?
- A. Fair enough.
- Q. Okay. And at some point by June 17th at 2013 at 6:51 a.m. you say: Give me a price where I've got to credit you and I don't have to credit you.
 - A. Right.
 - Q. And then it looks like if we go to the time, you say: Good deal. I appreciate that.
 - A. Where are we at here?
 - Q. Page with: Hey, Joe, good deal. I appreciate that. Make sure I have them in order. You have the one that says -- oh, no, there it is: I think this is the best way -- now he's not upset any more. That's 5:22.
 4:13 comes before 5:22. That one was at 6:51 a.m. that we just talked about. The next one will be at 4:13 p.m. from you.
- Then going to the bottom of -- if you go into this one -- this one (indicating).
 - A. June 17.

- Q. The bottom email, June 17, 2:56 p.m.
 - A. Okay. Well, it's funny you keep skipping around.
 - Q. Well, it's because -- so 2:56 comes before 4:13, so sometime the emails are chronologically, sometimes you scroll up. But regardless, they're from the same day.

So there's a line: If Danny is too upset, I would love for him to do the vocals on the mall and give me the opportunity to buy them from him versus sending them myself.

Can you read that?

- A. I believe. I can't really see it, though, but I believe what you're saying.
- Q. And Joe said that he didn't want to do a five-hour round-trip to Dallas to go to a studio and sing it.
 - A. Put down smirk on face.
 - Q. Fair enough.

And then he said he tried to sing it and he couldn't make it through without crying.

- A. Okay.
- Q. And then the last line: PS, in this contract, do I need to name Danny or just the band?
 - A. I don't know what he's babbling about there.

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1 Q. Okay. Fair enough.

The next one, and then I think we can fast forward some, but we can fast forward piecemeal so you make sure you've looked at all of them.

The next one is at 5:22, which is the one I'm looking at. This one.

A. Okay.

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Q. From Vince to Joe: Hey, Joe. I think this is the best way. No, he's not upset anymore. He just looks at it as a business deal. We can go one song at a time, if you wish. So this contract would deal with I Saw a Tiger. You would need to include me as the writer. Danny is the vocalist. Stating we have sold all rights to the composition song for \$1,500 and have no claims whatsoever to ownership and we can never use the song, play the song, et cetera, et cetera. In a nutshell, it's Joe's song.

Do you recall saying all that?

- A. Keep reading.
- Q. Okay. I'm no longer, thank God --
- A. That's all --
- Q. That's it? Okay. But you're also pro se today, right?
- A. (Indicating.)
 - Q. So if I've left anything out, feel free to add

- 1 it. We will do some great work together.
 - A. But you admitted yourself that these aren't all the emails. I mean, you're kind of cherry picking.
 - Q. These are all the emails that I have from him to you and you to him.
 - A. No, absolutely not. Oh, well, I haven't read them all. But do you have the one where he calls Shaquille O'Neal the biggest nigger that I've ever seen and I don't have a cage big enough to hold him?

Do you have the one from Joe asking me if I knew anybody to get rid of Carole?

Do you have the ones in here that he called his donors fat, ugly and stupid.

- O. To you?
- A. I don't know. I don't know. I could have sent them to friends or something.
- Q. Because none of that relates to this, and I've never seen those emails.
- A. Well, yeah, because whoever done this cherry picked.
 - O. Well, but --
- A. Or this can't be all the emails, you admitted that.
- Q. For purposes I'm talking about, the transfer of music rights agreements. I'm not talking about Carole

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And what I have is you saying I'm going to sell you everything for \$1,500, signing an agreement, and then keep repeatedly going back to how you caught him on the YouTube video.

- A. Which is true. But the 1,500, that doesn't cover -- that's why something is missing, because we agreed on more than that. And where are the emails of him saying, oh, I'm not that type of person. I'm getting my reality show on Animal Planet. I'll make everything good. You have so much more money coming, blah, blah, blah. I hope these are in there.
 - Q. We'll get through them.

Is that in the contract -- is any of that stuff in the contract from the transfer of music rights agreement that you refer to on June 17, 2013?

- A. No, and you'll notice there's no dollar amount either.
 - O. Right.
 - A. All right.
- Q. But the email address addresses the dollar amount of \$1,500.
 - A. That doesn't (indicating).
- Q. Correct, I agree with you the contract doesn't say it.

- A. All right. I mean, that's what you initially went to court with. Did I give him those songs because I liked his smile? That whole thing -- what is that saying? You know, there's no dollar amount.
- Q. But are you denying you sent the email from June 17, 2013, where you say this contract would deal with I Saw a Tiger. You would need to include me as the writer, Danny as the vocalist, stating that we have sold all rights for the composition song for \$1,500 and have no claims whatsoever to ownership and we can never use the song, play the song, et cetera, et cetera, in a nutshell it's Joe's songs. Those were your words?
 - A. Yeah. Yeah. I would have sent -- yeah.
- Q. And then the next page at 10:31 p.m. on June 17th: Hey, Joe. It may sound old and corny --
 - A. Okay. Where are we at?
 - Q. This one (indicating).
 - A. June 17th.
 - O. Here it is.

A man's word should be his bond. Nowadays you shake someone's hand, you've got to count your fingers afterwards. No, we will never post the song. You have my word on that. Danny's last name is Clinton. My last name is Johnson.

Did you say that?

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- A. Evidently.
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- Q. And sometime around then, you signed what we've marked as Plaintiff's exhibit, Transfer of Music Rights Agreement.

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A. Okay. After the fact. After he'd already ripped me off.

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Q. Whose sunglasses are those?

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A. I don't know about that analogy you're using there, man.

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For somebody to steal your work, do you know what that's like? For somebody to post a video -- he was just supposed to play the song in his gift shop. He wasn't supposed to lip-sync and act like he was a singer or writer. Don't you understand when somebody rips you off?

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Q. The Sun Says was also another song that was subject to the Transfer of Music Rights Agreement, which we'll mark as Plaintiff 3.

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Do you agree with me?

your backyard. Good on you to get that.

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A. Yes.

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Q. Is that signed by you and Danny?

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A. Yes. But it's still that same contract. This should be heard in the state of Oklahoma not in Florida,

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(Deposition Exhibit No. 3 was marked for

- 1 | identification.)
- 2 BY MR. PHILLIPS:
- Q. Plaintiff's 4 refers to My First Love. Was My
 First Love subject to the Transfer of Music Rights
 Agreement and Credits Agreement?
- A. Yes.

- Q. Is that your signature and Mr. Clinton's?
- A. Clinton, yeah. This agreement that will be given by the laws in the state of Oklahoma.
- 10 Q. Fair enough.
- 11 A. Not Florida.
- 12 Q. You can make that point every time.
- 13 (Deposition Exhibit No. 4 was marked for
- 14 identification.)
- 15 BY MR. PHILLIPS:
- 16 Q. Pretty Woman Lover, did you sign an agreement 17 for that song?
- 18 A. T did.
- 19 O. Okay. So we'll mark that as Plaintiff's 5.
- 20 (Deposition Exhibit No. 5 was marked for
- 21 identification.)
- 22 BY MR. PHILLIPS:
- Q. And then ultimately I'll present to you what
- 24 | we'll mark as Plaintiff's Exhibit 6 in a second. There
- 25 | was an agreement called Compensate Employee

1 | Confidentiality Agreement.

Did you seen that?

A. I did.

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Q. Okay. And the last paragraph of that: In the event you breach (or your agents) breach this

Confidentiality Agreement, you will pay as liquidated damages, and not as a penalty, the sum of \$1 million for each such breach.

Is that part of that agreement?

- A. Evidently.
- 11 (Deposition Exhibit No. 6 was marked for identification.)
- 13 BY MR. PHILLIPS:
 - Q. February 17th, 2014, it should be in that stack.
 - A. February what?
 - Q. 17th. Lawyers have numbering, it's called

 Bates stamping. And sometimes they over-Bates stamp and

 I wish we --
 - From Joe to Vince and Danny Clinton: Hey, guys, I've really enjoyed working with you both a lot. You're both awesome with what you do. I would love to continue to work with both of you much more in the future but don't want to get caught in between a money argument.
- 25 For Pretty Woman, I have sent Danny 1250 and Friday will

have Vince paid in full 1,250, also which paid the song 2,500 so any dispute will need to be worked out between you both as I really don't want to get caught in the middle of who deserves what amount.

Do you know what he's talking about where you and Danny were fighting over the amount of money due for songs?

A. No.

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Q. Joe says: For future songs, I will either pay 50/50 and you work out the studio amount between each of you or I will pay Vince a set of amount for writing and Danny a set amount to do vocals, studios or instrumentals or however you want to work it out. Makes no difference. We just can't get caught between -- but can't get caught between one gets more than the other or whatever.

Again, do you recall what he's talking about?

- A. I don't know.
- Q. Okay. And the email below that, 10:28 p.m. on February 17th from Vince to Joe: Your and my agreement is \$1,500 and 1,000 to Danny for My First Love which you've paid in full. And the same for Pretty Woman Lover, which you have paid me two to 400 and you said sending another 400 tonight so I'm owed another 500 on Pretty Woman Lover.

At that point did you address Joe owing you for

1 | I Saw a Tiger?

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- A. Are you talking about this (indicating)?
- Q. Yes. It appears you were paid up for I Saw a
 Tiger, GW and Me and The Sun Says by then; is that
 correct?
 - A. Yeah, whether I was paid up or not. I was never paid up.
 - Q. What do you mean?
 - A. We were supposed to get -- I was supposed to get -- we were supposed to get \$7,000 a song plus all this money coming when he got his reality show on Animal Planet.
 - Q. Where is that contract --
- 14 A. Well --
- 15 | 0. -- or email?
- A. You tell me where the email is. There was no contract. But you said yourself, these aren't all the emails, which I find curious.
- Q. These are all the emails I have, and I don't see --
- A. Well, how could you go from -- why wouldn't you have every email, the 300 emails? This is only, what,

 40, 30? You guys cherry picked.
- 24 O. No.
- 25 A. No?

- Q. We are just going through what I have.
 - A. Okay.

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- Q. But so far, I don't see any agreement for 7,000 a song, by your own words, right?
- 5 A. Not --
- Q. As if there were. In 2014 the prices were -- 1,400 or \$2,500 a song.
 - A. Right. Okay.
 - Q. And you kept an accounting, like on February 17, 2014, you kept an accounting with what Joe owed you. You kept telling him you still owe me on this one. You owe me on this one.
 - A. Okay.
 - Q. And then that an email you say: These are my songs, not fucking Danny's. I do all the work.
 - A. Wait a minute, man. Where are you now?
- 17 Q. Same place.
 - A. Here (indicating)?
- 19 Q. I think so.
 - A. Oh, okay. Which was true, I do all the work.
 - Q. And who -- what is your understanding of the -- did Carole Baskin depose you, of Big Cat Rescue, depose you related to Joe's finances?
- A. Baskin did, yes, because Joe obviously owed her money and she wanted to know what --

- Q. What he was spending his money on?
- A. Right.

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- Q. Going to February 18th. I'll tell you what, I'm glad mine have hole punches, so I don't get mine confused with yours.
 - A. What was the date again?
 - Q. February 18, 2014, here (indicating).

From Joe to Vince and Danny: Okay. So, Joe, referring to himself, is stuck between you two fighting over who gets what. Y'all work it out and let me know. As of this Friday, I paid \$2,500 for the song and get emails from both of you saying different figure of who gets what and who gets what for writing and who gets what for singing. And I will pay the studio.

And it looks like four hours later you say:

You sent me \$200 January 27th, 2014, and then \$400 on

January 31st, 2014, and \$400 yesterday. That's \$1,000.

Our agreement -- you said are -- our agreement is \$1,500,

you owe me 500 more. That's our agreement. I told fat

ass off last night.

You're referring to Danny?

- A. (Witness nods head affirmatively.)
- Q. Okay. That's a yes?
- A. Yeah.
- Q. It seems you to me guys are trying to fuck me.

- 1 What did he contact you with? He's such a nice Christian
- 2 | lad who just tries to be fair. You bought that bullshit.
- 3 He's a lazy egomaniac leach. You have no idea how many
- 4 jobs/money I've made that fucking guy. Do you know what
- 5 he's done for me? Nothing, all caps. And if you don't
- 6 believe me, ask him. If he can just name one thing he's
- 7 done for The Clinton Johnson Band, me, I'll fly out to
- 8 Oklahoma and buttfuck a Chinaman on Main Street at rush
- 9 hour, so you decide to not only take my money from me but
- 10 | to pay him first. I've told you over and over again
- 11 these are my fucking songs.
- Do you remember saying that?
- A. No, I do not. And you've cherry picked by your
- 14 own admission. I had 300 emails with him.
- Q. So you said, but you don't have any of them
- 16 remaining, correct?
- 17 A. Not that I know of. And what's the point of --
- 18 | why are you reading that? What are you asking? What's
- 19 | your question on it?
- Q. You don't recall sending that?

 - A. No. I dispute you cherry picking 300 emails and picking 30 of them. You don't have the one about Joe calling go Shaq a nigger, and you don't have a cage big enough to hold him. I don't see that here.
 - O. Because it doesn't exist.
 - A. Oh, it certainly does.
 - Q. Would you like to produce it? Please produce it.
- 10 A. I don't know. I don't know if I have it or if 11 I sent it to somebody.

So you're saying that I'm making that up?

- Q. I'm not here to be deposed today, but I don't have it and I've never seen it.
 - A. But you just said it doesn't exist.
- Q. It doesn't exist. You don't have a copy of it, and I don't have a copy of it.
 - A. On this table.
- Q. So moving to June 15th, 2014, this one, from Joe to Vince and Danny: Look, first of all, I am far too professional to play fucking games. Is this how you people treat all of your clients or have you had any before? You would think you would have a bit more professional attitude with someone that's spent nearly 30,000 with you two.

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So what is the Carole song and -- so where is the Carole song and the Fun song at? These are the ones I was proposed to, and if they are different lyrics, I suggest someone stop playing games and produce them. I will not buy something sight unseen any longer if these are the games people -- games they're playing at my expense.

Is that related to Killer Carole?

- A. I don't know what he's babbling about.
- Q. Okay. What is Killer Carole?
- A. What is it?
- 12 Q. Yeah.

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- A. It's a song.
- O. Who wrote it?
- A. I did, of course.
- Q. Did Joe ask you to write it?

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A. Say that again.

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Q. Joe purchased from you I Saw a Tiger, GW and Me, You Can't Believe, The Sun Says, You've Got a

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Guardian and Harry Reid as noted in the email on June 15,

unseen.

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- A. No, I dispute that.
- Q. Okay. So what did you mean: And for the 10th time you bought the songs I wrote, I Saw a Tiger, GW and Me, You Can't Believe, The Sun Says, You've Got a Guardian, Harry Reid, sight unseen?
- A. I don't know. I would need Joe's -- what I'm talking about here. You just have what I'm saying. What the hell was he saying?
- Q. I already -- you say: I already wrote and recorded My First Love and Pretty Woman Lover, which I sent you, and you bought them. The only song of mine I ran by you is Your Love Can Do and that's only because I gave fat boy Do You Ever Wonder and he sent it to you behind my back and you didn't like it so I wrote Your Love Can Do.

I think the substance of this is you're telling

Joe you don't get editorial control -- you don't get to

approve my lyrics. I'm sending you songs and you're

paying for them, right?

- A. Okay.
- Q. And you're giving examples of songs that you wrote and he paid for, sight unseen, correct?
- A. That's the way it was, right? Unlike him saying -- which I have 50 articles, all right, different

1 articles, interviews with Exotic claiming he wrote the 2 songs.

- Q. Which he's allowed to do by your own emails and contract.
 - A. No.

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Q. Mr. Johnson, on June 17th, 2013, you said, to Joe: So this contract would deal with I Saw a Tiger, you would need to include me as the writer, Danny as the vocalist, stating we have sold all rights to the composition song for \$1,500 and have no claims whatsoever to ownership and we can never use the song, play the song, et cetera, et cetera. In a nutshell it's Joe's song.

That was your --

- A. That's part of it. You haven't got where he hasn't paid full amount.
- Q. He did for I Saw a Tiger. You even said in the email we just went through that he paid for that completely.
- A. No, absolutely not. He didn't pay because, for one thing, that shows he lied about, you know, that's where a lot of money was supposed to come from.
 - Q. Which hasn't been referenced in any --
 - A. Not from what you brought.
 - Q. Okay. And not what you brought?

- A. I don't have anything. You have them all, though. You have every email, and you just cherry picked these.
 - Q. I Saw a Tiger, Contract and Confidentiality

 Agreement and your email.

Is there anything in those that required you to be paid more than the \$1,500 that you said on June 17th, 2014?

- A. Not from what you brought.
- Q. Okay. Anything that you have in your possession?
- 12 A. I don't know.

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that you have criminal wrongdoing related to the song

Killer Carol, then I think the Fifth would be applicable.

But I'm just asking you if Joe offered to pay you -- if you were telling Joe he needed to pay another \$1,250 for the rights to the song Killer Carol.

- A. And I'm telling you I plead the Fifth.
- Q. Okay. What was Killer Carol about?
- A. I plead the Fifth.
- O. Who wrote it?

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- A. I plead the Fifth.
- Q. It appears you intend to obstruct this deposition, and I have flown all the way across the country at a very significant expense, and I'm going to have to come back to ask these questions.

So are you going to continue to plead the Fifth on the rest of my questions?

New guy? All I want is what was agreed on, pay 1,250 for writing The Fun Song. Once paid I'll send you the Killer Carol song

Do you dispute that you sent that email?

They're absolutely nothing.

- Q. Do you feel that you own 100 percent of I Saw a Tiger?
 - A. Yes.
- Q. Why?
 - A. Because I wrote the song and -- because I wrote the song and all the promises from your client he broke, so, yeah, it's my song. If you ever wrote a song, when you create something, it's yours. And if you make a deal to sell it, I understand, you're a big boy, sell it. You can't deal with a liar, though, man. Everybody has to, you know, meet their end of the bargain.

- Q. Okay. So you feel because Joe may have told you a lie that the fact that he paid you for I Saw a Tiger was null and void?
 - A. Yes, he paid me some for the song.
 - Q. Did he pay you completely for I Saw a Tiger?
- A. No, he did not. He never paid me completely for any of the songs. That's what I'm telling you. That's what you're missing in this stuff.
- Q. Because you contend there's some other agreement years later that he --
 - A. Not years later, during this time period.
- Q. Okay. All I've seen is you repeatedly in your emails refer to a \$1,500 figure per song that you negotiated and that he paid.
- A. Fair enough. But there is more to it than that, and if you had every email you would know.
- Q. How are you not defrauding Joe by claiming you own 100 percent of I Saw a Tiger when he bought it from you?
- A. Didn't I just answer that? He never paid me what he was supposed to.
 - Q. And what is it he said he'd pay you?
- A. He said he'd pay seven grand a song. Then he said he had a -- oh, geez -- his exact wording, there's several. It would always change. Man, I'm not like

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- that. When anything ever happens to these songs, I'll make it right to you, brother, and all that bull -- nonsense.
 - Q. But you don't have any proof of that, correct?
- 5 A. I don't know.
- 6 Q. Who recorded the album Mind Guerilla,

 - Q. Because you didn't sing?
 - A. No. I can't sing. I'm a terrible singer.
 - Q. But Joe shouldn't be able to claim -- it's your opinion that Joe shouldn't be able to claim rights to music he didn't sing, but yet The Vince Johnson Band claimed that the music you didn't sing --
- A. No, not that Joe didn't sing. He didn't write.

 As a songwriter, I can do whatever the hell I want with

- my song. I can have you sing it. Is it your contention that I can't do what I want with my songs?
 - Q. Once you sell them.
 - A. How do you explain songs like My Angel Don't Fly that Exotic's trying to take credit for?
 - Q. That's the subject of this lawsuit. Was there a contract for My Angel Don't Fly?
 - A. No.

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Q. I believe you told the court that Joe Exotic illegally used your songs without your consent and without any compensation.

Do you agree that's a false statement?

- A. I plead the Fifth.
- Q. Okay. I believe you told the court, Maldonado never paid money I was promised.

Do you agree that's a false statement?

- A. I plead the Fifth.
- Q. Have you received any compensation for any -- in any way from Carole Baskin, Howard Baskin or Big Cat Rescue?
 - A. Absolutely not.
 - O. Killer Carol is about Carole Baskin?
- 23 A. Uh-huh.
- 24 0. That's a yes?
- 25 A. Yes.

- Q. And it's about the death of Don Lewis?
 - A. Yes.

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- Q. And it's about Carole Baskin causing the death of Don Lewis?
 - A. Presumably.
 - Q. And you wrote it?
- A. Yes, I wrote it.
 - O. Do you believe Carole Baskin killed Don Lewis?
 - A. I won't answer that.
- Q. What happened with -- was there some dispute with a musician in Florida over some of these songs?
- A. As I told the court, and I'll tell you, I don't know anybody in Florida. I've never been to Florida, so I don't know what in the world you're talking about.
- Q. In your deposition with -- started by Carole Baskin, didn't you acknowledge the validity of the confidentiality agreement?
 - A. I plead the Fifth.
- Q. In your deposition there was a question: Did you ever talk -- did Joe ever talk to you about and tell you that you -- that he wanted you to keep quiet about the fact that he's not singing those songs on those recordings?
- And you said: Yeah, that came up after a while.

1 Do you remember that?

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- A. This is from the Baskin deposition, according to you?
 - Q. Yeah. She talked about Joe wanting the fact that he wasn't the primary singer to remain confidential.
 - A. I plead the Fifth.
 - Q. In your deposition, you said you've talked to Joe twice in your life on the phone.

Are you now saying it was three times?

- 10 A. I believe it was -- it could be two; could be 11 four. I don't know.
 - Q. I believe you said that everything -- okay. You were asked if you still had emails and you said, no, everything from that guy has been deleted when the computer crashed about six months ago.

So your computer has crashed and you deleted the email?

- A. I plead the Fifth.
- Q. What instruments do you play in The Vince
 Johnson Band?
 - A. Anything with strings.
 - Q. How much input did Joe Exotic have in the lyrics to Killer Carol?
- A. Absolutely none.
 - Q. In an email -- your deposition references an

- email between you and Carole Baskin on December 11, 2017.
- Do you still have that?
- 3 A. No.

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- Q. Do you recall emailing Carole Baskin?
- A. I recall she emailed me about that book I was telling you about. I don't recall emailing her.
 - Q. In your deposition, it says that you said Joe really wants me to record this song I wrote for him, referring to Killer Carol.

Do you recall going to Carole Baskin and reporting that Joe wanted to record or have Killer Carol recorded?

- A. I don't remember. I plead the Fifth on that.
- Q. Who is Tracy, T-r-a-c-y, Mckeown,
- $15 \mid M-c-k-e-o-w-n$?
- 16 A. You tell me.
 - Q. Okay. You were asked: When is first time you learned of him taking the song of yours that he didn't have the authority to take?
 - And you said: About a month ago when that dude, Jeff, contacted me.
 - Do you recall being alerted by somebody by the name of Jeff that Joe was using your songs?
 - A. 2017? I knew long before that.
 - Q. Okay. Have you had conversations with either

Jeff Johnson or Jeff Lowe about Joe Exotic?

- A. Yeah, Jeff Johnson. That must be what you were referring to earlier, but you've taken that out of context. That doesn't make sense.
- Q. You testified that you and Johnson -- you said -- they asked: Can you tell me what you and Mr. Johnson talked about?

And you said: His hatred -- your mutual hatred for Joe. I don't know the guy, all right? He just contacted me out of the blue.

So you talked to Johnson about how much you hated Joe Exotic?

- A. About our mutual hatred. I don't know the guy, and he killed hisself, evidently.
 - Q. He did. Do you still hate Joe Exotic?
- A. No, more of a pity thing now. Yeah, I've seen Joe for what he is, a con man.
- Q. Do you not feel like a con man given that Joe paid you \$1,500 for music and now you're saying you own 100 percent of it?
- A. No, because he never paid what he was supposed to.
- Q. Do you feel you owe Joe a refund for the amounts that he's paid?
 - A. No, absolutely no, because how much money has

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- he made off my music acting like the performer? How many CDs has he sold?
 - Q. Was that part of the contract?
- 4 A. What?

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- Q. That you were to receive a royalty on a license --
- A. Absolutely not, no. But money-wise, if anybody owes anybody, trust me, it's Exotic owes me.
 - Q. Who sang Killer Carol, was that the Jeff guy?
- 10 A. Uh-huh.
- 11 Q. What was his last name?
- 12 A. Bowen.
 - Q. Did he rerecord or sing on the rereleases of I Saw a Tiger and the other ones on that album?
- 15 A. Yes.
- Q. Did Joe Exotic give him or you permission to do so?
- 18 A. Are you serious?
- 19 O. Yes.
- A. No. I don't need his permission to do what I
 want with my own songs, songs I wrote.
- Q. Even though you sold them to Joe?
- 23 A. Even though he never paid me.
- Q. You said he never paid you. You don't dispute that you've received nearly if not more than \$30,000 from

1 Joe.

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- A. No, I dispute that all right.
- Q. You dispute that he paid you \$1,500 as requested for I Saw a Tiger?
 - A. I don't know. This is years ago.

MR. PHILLIPS: That's all the questions that I have. You are entitled to put on the record anything that you want.

THE WITNESS: I would like to put on the record that these emails he brought are inadequate, incomplete. He's cherry picked things favorable to his client and has left out hundreds of emails that would prove what I'm saying, that Exotic never paid the full amount and Exotic lied time after time.

Exotic asked me if I knew anybody to get rid of Carole.

And another thing, why this contract -- it's

not a contract. It's an agreement, isn't valid, because of his character, for one thing.

Another is it's totally based on fraud. This agreement was set up for fraud, so he could pretend he's the singer, writer, whatever. It's set up for fraud. I already said that. I'm sorry.

And his own agreement says this shall be governed by the laws in State of Oklahoma, yet for some strange reason, this is being heard in Florida.

That's it. Thank you.

- 2. I agree that I shall not during, or at any time while my being employed/volunteering with the Company, use for myself or others, or disclose or divulge to others including future employees, government agencies, animal rights groups, parents, friends, or relative any trade secrets, confidential information, or any other proprietary data of the Company in violation of this agreement.
- 3. That upon the termination of my employment/volunteering from the Company:
- (a) I shall return to the Company all documents and property of the Company, including but not necessarily limited to: drawings, blueprints, reports, manuals, correspondence, customer lists, computer programs, keys, pictures, uniforms, audio or video and all other materials and all copies thereof relating in any way to the Company's business, or in any way obtained by me during the course of employ/volunteering. I further agree that I shall not retain copies, notes, or abstracts of the foregoing.
- (b) The Company may notify any future or prospective employer or third party of the existence of this agreement, and shall be entitled to full injunctive relief for any breach.
- (c) This agreement shall be binding upon me and my personal representatives and successors in interest, and shall inure to the benefit of the Company, its successors and assigns in the United States.
- 4. In the event of any breach by you (or your agents) of this Confidentiality Agreement, you shall pay as liquidated damages, and not as a penalty, the sum of One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) for each such breach, which the parties agree represents reasonable compensation for the harm incurred as a result of such breach.
